

Mr. Tiny Jam's Ukulele Boot Camp

Parent FAQ

What will students learn?

The parts of the ukulele and proper instrument care, rhythm and timing, beginner strumming patterns, simple chords, and group performance skills, all leading to a short, supportive recital on the final day of camp.

Who can take lessons?

The 5-day boot camp is designed for kids ages 7 to 12, no experience needed. Private lessons are available for both children and adults. Hybrid packages that combine boot camp with private lessons are also available for faster progress.

When and where does camp meet?

Camp runs Monday through Friday, one hour per day, during after-school hours. The exact time slot is announced based on sign-ups. Camps meet at small regional parks around Orange County, and the public venue is announced to enrolled families once enrollment is confirmed.

What should my child bring?

A water bottle and a positive attitude. If your child has a ukulele, please bring it; if not, ask about instrument options when you sign up. Snacks are encouraged on recital day.

What does it cost?

Ukulele Boot Camp is \$80 per session, or \$400 for the full week. Private lessons are \$60 per session. A premium package is available that includes a take-home ukulele, play-along access, bonus practice materials, and one complimentary private lesson. Ask about special deals: Mother-Daughter days, Father-Son days, and group family packages.

What if my child misses a day?

Because each day builds on the previous session, missed days are not refundable. With at least 24 hours' notice, a missed session may be credited toward one private make-up lesson.

What happens if weather interrupts a session?

We will first try to reschedule. If families agree, the session may be moved indoors to a suitable location. If neither option works, that day will be refunded in full.

How big are the groups?

Boot camp runs with a minimum of 2 students and is capped at 5 students to keep instruction personal and focused. The program moves forward once minimum enrollment is met.
